Message from our National Director

Greetings in the Name of our Risen Lord!



This is a very special time of the year. We are moving rapidly towards Christmas and yet deep down in my heart I wish we could move into "slow motion" mode in order that we enjoy, embrace and savour the season. This is indeed a time for us to enter the story, not as a shepherd or a wise man or any of the players in the narrative, but to enter the story as a recipient of the benefits of the incarnation of Christ...Salvation full and free! In the wisdom of the church, four weeks are required to get ready for Christmas. This

period is called ADVENT. You see, we can't just arrive at Christmas on Christmas Eve, we can't expect to really "enter" the experience just minutes after the last financial transaction has been made at the mall and the frustration of fighting traffic is still simmering as we take our place in the Candlelight Service. No, we need to approach Christmas with careful and prayerful preparation understanding that every gift we buy for someone else and every meal we prepare for loved ones and strangers is a token and an expression of the presence of Jesus already in our lives.

Two years ago Pat and I attended District Assemblies in the Middle East. I will not soon forget standing on the balcony of the hotel as the sun was going down. From a nearby minaret, the fourth of five calls to prayer echoed across the city. I also remember hearing other messages from loudspeakers reminding Jews that Sabbath was about to begin. Then into this mix came another sound, the sound of church bells. These are more than steel designs swinging in a belfry. In the Anglican, Catholic and Lutheran traditions it was the practice to ring these bells three times a day, six in the morning, noon and six in the evening, calling the Christian faithful to recite the Lord's Prayer. The words of that prayer invoke God's Kingdom to come on earth as it is in heaven. In this wonderful land we call home with a variety of clarion calls to "faith", I say to you... ring the bells of hope, truth and radical optimism that God is redeeming His world through His Son Jesus, the One whose birth we now prepare to celebrate.

Hear the words of Henry Wadsworth Longfellow in 1864.....

"I HEARD THE BELLS ON CHRISTMAS DAY,
THEIR OLD FAMILIAR CAROLS PLAY,
AND WILD AND SWEET THE WORDS REPEAT
OF PEACE ON EARTH GOODWILL TO MEN,
I THOUGHT HOW AS THE DAY HAD COME
THE BELFRIES OF ALL CHRISTENDOM
HAD ROLLED ALONG THE UNBROKEN SONG
OF PEACE ON EARTH GOODWILL TO MEN,
AND IN DESPAIR I BOWED MY HEAD,
THERE IS NO PEACE ON EARTH I SAID
FOR HATE IS STRONG AND MOCKS THE SONG
OF PEACE ON EARTH GOODWILL TO MEN.

THEN PEALED THE BELLS MORE LOUD AND DEEP,
GOD IS NOT DEAD NOR DOTH HE SLEEP,
THE WRONG SHALL FAIL, THE RIGHT PREVAIL
WITH PEACE ON EARTH GOODWILL TO MEN,
THEN RINGING, SINGING ON ITS WAY

JOYCE MACMILLAN



We are saddened to hear of the passing of Joyce MacMillan on November 17th, 2018 in Anderson, Indiana. Joyce was the wife of Reverend Lorne MacMillan who was District Superintendent of the Canada Central District from 1979 - 1992 and Uncle of Dr. Clair MacMillan, former National Director and District Superintendent of Canada Atlantic Church of the Nazarene.

She was born May 11, 1927, in Bloomington, the daughter of John and Marie (VanBuskirk) Reeves. She graduated from Bloomington High School and attended Olivet Nazarene University. On July 6, 1951, she married Lorne MacMillan at

the Bloomington First Church of the Nazarene, and together they raised their two sons, David and Ray. As a minister's wife, she and the family moved to various churches throughout Indiana, including in Marion, Muncie, Peru, Auburn, Winchester, and Anderson, even for a time ministering in Toronto, Canada. She spent several winters at the Florida Holiness Campground.

She always supported Lorne in his ministry and also served her own as a Sunday school and Vacation Bible Study teacher and as president of the Nazarene Missionary Society. She loved reading, writing, traveling sewing, crocheting, and singing. Mostly, she enjoyed spending time with her granddaughters and family and friends.

She is survived by her husband of 67 years, Lorne MacMillan, of Anderson; sons, David MacMillan and Ray MacMillan, of Anderson; daughter-in-law, Sheila MacMillan, of Anderson; granddaughters, Ann MacMillan, Jill (Matt) Spiess, Kylie Case, Katie MacMillan and Kristen MacMillan; great-granddaughter, Klaire Case; brothers, Chester Reeves, of Lambertville, Michigan, John Reeves, of Scottsdale, Arizona, Paul Reeves, of Bloomington, and Jim Reeves of Phoenix, Arizona; sister, Joanne Hayes, of Santa Claus; several nieces and nephews; and a large extended family.

She was preceded in death by her parents and her brother, Ben Reeves. Services were held on November 20th, at the Anderson First Church of the Nazarene.







NCM CANADA NEWS

Thank you for your gifts through the NCM Canada Gift Catalogue over this past year.

Goats for Malawi - In July, goats were distributed in Malawi to 134 farmers who are practicing conservation agriculture. Both the goats and the conservation agriculture project are funded by gifts given through the NCMC gift catalogue.

The day-to-day farming in Africa is mostly done by women as you can see in the picture (below). They also tend the animals.



The goats have proved to be a double blessing as they provide milk for the children as well as manure for the fields to help fertilize the soil. Just recently, some of the goats had kids (baby goats). The first goat born is to be returned to the project so that other farmers who are adopting conservation agriculture can receive a goat. It is a gift that keeps on giving!

Desks for Zukuma Nazarene School -Students at Zukuma Nazarene School no longer have to sit on the ground for classes. Thanks to Canadian Nazarenes, they now have desks! Desks were provided for the over 300 students, along with book shelves, and tables and chairs for the teachers.



Child Development Centres in Sri Lanka - school supplies, hens & roosters NCM Canada continues to fund 3 child development centres in Sri Lanka. There the children receive school supplies and after school tutoring. They also receive a nutritious meal and annual medical check ups. They learn Bible stories and Christian songs. Parents of the children have received hens and roosters. Churches are being planted in these communities. Wells for Liberia and Sierra Leone - 13 wells have been drilled in Sierra Leone serving about 17,000 people and 12 wells have been drilled in Liberia serving about 30,000 people. Training in hygiene and sanitation has also been provided as part of this project aimed at reducing illness due to water borne diseases. Thank you to Canadian Nazarenes for funding these wells!

Discipleship and Leadership Development Projects - Pastors and leaders in creative access countries in Africa are greatly encouraged by training and discipleship materials that they can use in their own contexts.

As well, 10 selected pastors and leaders in Bangladesh are working towards a Masters of Divinity degree. These will provide solid leadership for the Church in Bangladesh for the coming years and they will be training others.
