A GOOD STORY IS A POWERFUL THING

It can change minds, bring together differing worldviews, point to a greater truth we would have missed otherwise or reveal something that was hidden before.

In fact, it is said that after nourishment, shelter and companionship, stories are the thing we need most in the world.

Stories change hearts, too.

Just ask John Janzen who works in community education at Siloam Mission.

As part of our emphasis on building a community of care and cooperation, his job is to bring understanding to young people and dispel myths about those who experience homelessness.

Last year, John went to 74 schools to present about Siloam Mission and toured 94 school groups through our building. Because of his efforts many schools have started initiatives to help the less fortunate in our city – and many of the children have gotten their whole family involved.

Over the years, John has found that children are impacted more by a story than by facts. They listen better, remember more and understand more clearly if he tells them a story rather than the harsh facts of poverty and homelessness.

And in fact, the same thing goes for adults.

So John set about to create a story called Blink's Garden. It's a moving and powerful story about a girl who can see beauty where others cannot. And although she is scoffed at, she perseveres for years until things begin to change; until the beauty she sees becomes visible to others as well.

It's the story of many of the city's less fortunate and the volunteers who serve them day in and day out. Every day more than 600 people come through our doors. All of them have something beautiful to offer. Some see it, others are blind to it.

I have to admit on some days I have a hard time seeing beauty in people. Imagine if we as a society would see the beauty in each downtrodden person. Nobody would be without a home tonight.

Siloam Mission has been providing care for the less fortunate for close to 30 years. Our community of volunteers, staff and supporters have made significant strides in changing the lives of thousands of people each year.

They've been persistent – engaging Manitobans to see the beauty where it is hard to find at times.

Blink's Garden first premiered at the Winnipeg Fringe Festival, then played at the Edmonton Fringe Festival and in Toronto this summer.

The success of the story in changing hearts and minds in schools and festivals led to the completion of a storybook and CD. Now schools and parents across Manitoba can use it to help their children see beauty in people and places they may not have before.

Homelessness will continue well into 2017, and likely at least until the children in school right now will run the world.

I hope they will not have lost their ability to see beauty when it is their time to care for our communities.

All I know is that a good story is a good start.

BERNIE POTVIN RETIRES

Dr. Bernie Potvin is retiring from his position as Associate Professor of Education - a program he helped design and establish. Over the years, he has served in various capacities at Ambrose, beginning with the development of the Bachelor of Education (After Degree) program, and serving as the Director and, more recently, Interim Associate Dean, of the program. Along the way, Dr. Potvin has helped with the development of online learning in the Ambrose Seminary, and taught courses in Educational Psychology. For a short while, he also served as Dean of Arts and Science.

Developing education curriculum in Afghanistan

For the past five years, he has also invested deeply beyond Ambrose, leading a team of international educators in building a teaching and learning infrastructure – from the ground up – in Afghanistan. Sponsored by the Canadian government (Global Affairs Canada), working in partnership with a number of international governments and agencies, this labour of love has resulted in the creation of a national curriculum and the training of teachers in challenging post—war circumstances.

"Integration for us has always been in the particulars and not found in the generalities and abstractions of Christianity. Truly, the hint half guessed, the gift half understood (in our program) for us has been first saying 'yes' to the incarnation."

"The value added has been shaping the lives of over a hundred graduates, most of whom have taken up their careers in schools. Also, personally, I have valued the chance to work with some of the most amazing, inspiring people I have ever worked with. As I retire I am pleased that the foundation for future good work has been laid and that the future is indeed good."
